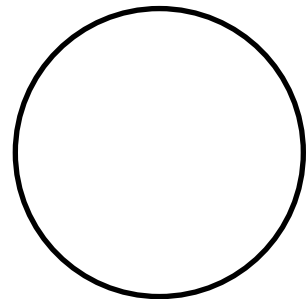
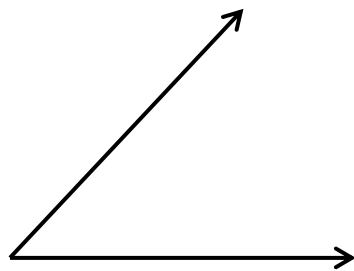
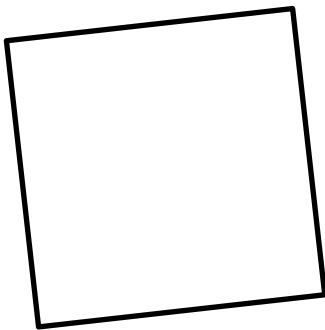


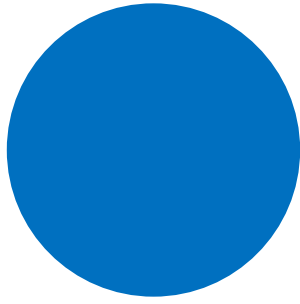
Geometry Scavenger Hunts
